Education:

Master's degree with Current Louisiana License:

- Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), or
- Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC), or
- Licensed Addiction Counselor (LAC)

Experience:

Minimum of two (2) years of professional experience in the delivery of behavioral health services, of which 1 year involved the delivery of addiction treatment services. Additional certification as an Addiction Counselor is preferred. Work experience should include familiarity with behavioral health systems and available addiction treatment models. Must be able to demonstrate clinical and interpersonal competence. Strong verbal, computer, and writing skills are necessary.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Communication skills: written and verbal including computer functionality.
- Knowledge of substance use disorder treatment, skills working with diverse populations, and awareness of community stakeholders.
